IDENTIFYING SOURCES (first, identify type of legal research: traditional, normative, empirical, historical, foreign/int'l, "Law and"--social science, science):

Primary sources: BNA (e.g., Health Law Reporter), LexisNexis Congressional, FDSys/GPO Access, CQ Electronic Library, Westlaw, Lexis

Secondary sources:

- **Books, gov't docs, and electronic sources:** Library Catalogs--LAWPAC/LAWPAC Plus, Chinook, Prospector, WorldCat, and Google Books; Google
- **Dissertations and theses:** ProQuest Dissertations and Theses
- **Legal journal articles:** Wise Researcher, Westlaw, Lexis, Index to Legal Periodicals, LegalTrac, HeinOnline, SSRN/Bepress (pre-print), Google Scholar
- **Social science journal articles:** Wise Researcher, Academic Search Premier, JSTOR, Web of Science (Social Sciences Citation Index), Social Sciences Full Text, Sociology Abstracts, PsycInfo, Google Scholar
- **Medical journal articles:** PubMed, Web of Science (Science Citation Index)
- **News articles:** Westlaw, Lexis, ProQuest Newspapers, Ethnic Newswatch, Alternative Press Index, Google News, Chronicle of Higher Education
